

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR LIVESTOCK AND AGRICULTURE PARTICIPANTS

1. The drive-in entry for livestock/ Agriculture will continue to be Gate 4 off livestock area.
2. Effective August 17, 2000, the Board of Trustees of the South Florida Fair and Palm Beach County Expositions, voted that there would be absolutely **no** animal sales to the public, with the exception of those amended by the board, during the annual fair. Rules and regulations have been revised to reflect this Fair Board action.
3. The IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and the South Florida Fair shall govern the competitions at the South Florida Fair.
4. Except as otherwise permitted by law, NO DOGS are allowed in any exhibit tent/building unless they are scheduled for a demonstration or competition.
5. Each exhibitor must complete, in it's entirety, an entry form to receive premium monies.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

ALL EXHIBITORS

1. All entries and awards in all livestock departments shall be subject to the rules and regulations published in the premium list.
2. Entries close: **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY DECEMBER 1st.**
3. **All warts must be removed prior to arrival on fairgrounds.**
4. Special rules for the physically challenged will apply.
5. No changes will be allowed once entry forms are received; however, substitutions will be accepted up to **January 5** (unless otherwise listed).

BEEF AND DAIRY CATTLE OPEN SHOWS

1. The owner is responsible for care, management and feeding of their own animals.
2. Animals must be shown in their respective age classes and be exhibited accordingly in their classes by age.
3. Cattle will be bedded on sand.
4. **Registration numbers must be entered on Fair entry forms prior to mailing.**
5. EXHIBITOR PASSES WILL BE ISSUED AS FOLLOWS:
OWNER/ HERDSMAN: 1 - 5 Head = 2 passes 6 - 10 Head = 3 passes 11 & Over = 4 Passes,
(One of which is a parking permit).
6. **THERE WILL BE A \$12.00 FEE FOR EACH TIE AND TACK SPACE USED BY ALL SHOW EXHIBITORS. THIS WILL INCLUDE ALL YOUTH EXHIBITORS. THESE FEES **SHOULD** ACCOMPANY ENTRY FORMS.**
7. Exhibit area and tie out area must be cleaned of all materials except sand before release form will be issued. Please cooperate with this request.
8. There must be at least five (5) animals of the same breed entered to hold a show.
9. NO DOGS ALLOWED INSIDE TENTS OR BUILDINGS.
10. No water tubs are to be placed in aisles. No hoses will be allowed across aisles.
11. **Entry blanks must be filled out completely. Indicate if you plan to make entries in group classes, but it is not necessary to name the animals which make your group until after judging of the individual classes. Entries in group classes must have been exhibited previously in individual classes. Please indicate sire/dam's name and registration number**
12. No walk-in entries will be accepted in or at the ring.
13. All breeds must comply with breed association rules.

BEEF CATTLE to be shown in the open shows refer to schedule for check in day/ time. Exhibitors must check in with the Show Secretary and State Veterinarian to receive parking passes and other information. Please check the show schedule to determine your check in day.

AMERICAN BRAHMAN BREEDERS ASSOCIATION

Special Rules

1. Animals must be registered in the American Brahman Breeders Association to be eligible to compete in association sponsored shows. The registration certificate (or photocopy) for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or manager of the show at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
2. The registration number and the animal identification number (number branded on animal) of (1) each animal must be entered in an individual class, (2) the sire of each get-of-sire entry and (3) the dam of each produce-of-dam entry must be listed on the entry card of each animal entered.
3. Entries that have not complied with rules one (1) and two (2) will not be eligible to show, receive premium monies or earn points in the association's Register of Renown.
4. Animals eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in individual classes.
5. Entries will be listed numerically according to age (oldest first) in catalogs and judging schedules.
Include animal identification number (number brand) as a part of identification. When entering the arena for judging, the handlers will line cattle up numerically in the same order.
6. Judges will be allowed to comment on placing in selected classes when conditions permit.
7. Each animal will be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical or circulatory constriction including banding or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Injections of foreign substances for cosmetic purposes shall be prohibited. If to the satisfaction of the ABBA's staff, officers, executive committee or board of directors, any animal has had its natural conformation and structure altered; then said animal shall be ruled ineligible to compete until such time the executive committee and owner/owners have reviewed the case.
8. In cases where families, companies, corporations, etc. are operated as a unit under the same management but have cattle also registered in the name of the individual partners, said cattle, even though bearing a different ownership brand, are eligible to be shown in competition under the firm name provided they have not been and will not be shown in the name of the individuals.
9. For females being shown in the three oldest classes *CURRENT YEAR LESS THREE YEARS* females calved January 1 - December 31, 2004, exhibitor must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian to be presented to show officials at time of check-in or registration paper check. The show reserves the right to perform pregnancy determination by palpation for females in the above classes at any given ABBA approved show if an official protest has been filed. Females exhibited in the last two classes at the Spring Shows **MUST** have a calf at side. For Fall Shows only the last two classes of females are required to have a calf at side also. The only exemption from this rule will be cows that have already weaned a calf and a registration certificate of the calf **MUST** be presented to the judge.
10. *All bulls will be shown with a nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached.*
For Bulls being shown in the oldest class, the exhibitor must have a certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian stating the bull has produced viable semen. The certificate must be available for inspection by the judge on request.
11. This deals with the produce of dam classes and the get-of-sire class:
Embryo Produce of Dam - Two animals from the above classes produced by one dam by embryo transfer either or both sexes may be represented. No ownership requirement.
Natural Produce of Dam - Two natural born animals produced by one dam from the above classes, either or both sexes may be represented. No ownership requirement.
Get-Of-Sire - Four animals from at least two dams by one sire from the above individual classes, both sexes represented. No ownership requirement.
12. No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one produce or embryo-produce of dam per dam.
13. Cows that are exhibited with calves at side must be in a lactating stage. Calves must be shown and exhibited with their dams and said calves must not exceed 240 days of age on day of judging. The judge will be made aware by the ring steward for those cows whose calves are ineligible to show by this rule
14. Cattle will not be allowed to show if their switches have been balled or glitter applied to their skin.
15. (The intent of the ABBA in shows that exhibit a large number of cattle is to divide the cattle into separate red and grey divisions. (Revised 10/13/05) If so, the following procedure will apply. All grey cattle and solid black cattle will show grey. Red, black & white speckled or red & white speckled cattle will show red. Cattle with questionable colored pigmentation may be entered in the color division the breeder selects, however, said cattle are subject to inspection by a three (3) member ABBA committee. If the Color Committee disagrees with the breeder, the pedigree and color of said animal will then be used to aid in the final determination.

In those cases where questionable colored cattle possess both red and grey breeding, then the committee will make the final determination. The decision of the committee is final. Once animals have been classified they will remain in that classification unless they were young at time of classification and it is apparent that they have changed their color. In the get-of-sire and produce-of-dam classes, breeders will not be allowed to show cattle of mixed color. They will be entered as to the color division they are assigned by the color committee of the show. (Effective July 1, 2006) At split shows where the Color Committee is not present, a staff member with two (2) ABBA Directors will clarify questionable colored cattle for that particular show. The final classification will be done by the Color Committee. (Revised 08/99)

16. The owner of record of any registered animal entered in an ABBA approved show and/or his/her agent, exhibitor, fitter, handler and/or representative releases ABBA and its representatives from any and all liability that seller/owner might claim as a result of any kind sustained before, during, or after handling cattle for any ABBA board approved activity.
17. For shows to remain approved point shows by ABBA, they must maintain a forty (40) head average for the previous two years.
18. The official ABBA rules & procedures governing showing & exhibiting of registered Brahman cattle supersede any rules printed in any show catalog.
19. In an attempt to insure that all animals receive an equal evaluation at the National and International Shows, classes with more than 30 entries may at the discretion of the Show Management and/or ABBA Officials be split by age as evenly as possible.

Special Rules

1. All animals must be representative to the breed and must have registration papers of the respective breed.
2. All animals are subjected to a medical examination in order to determine age and each animal will be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification.
3. Nurse cows are not permitted. Calves must be weaned prior to 8 months of age.
4. All animals must have some form of permanent identification - tattoo, firebrand, or identifying marks recognized by Breed Association.
5. No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than two animals or two groups of animals in any one class, provided, however, an exhibitor may show a third animal in only one individual class for the sole purpose of qualifying and entering the get-of-sire class. **(Third animal not eligible for premium money).**
6. A minimum of 5 animals will be required to make a show.

2. All entries must have legible tattoos that agree with their registration certificates, and tattoos must be checked and verified by an APA official at the show on the day of arrival.
3. All entries must be purebred, or full-blood Pinzgauer.
4. All entries must be red and solid faced, have a white underbelly and a predominately white tail.
5. All entries will be subject to sifting for correctness of papers and suitability to show.
6. Entries in the group classes must also show in an individual class.
7. Animals will enter the show ring in ascending order according to age, youngest to oldest.
8. Classes with fewer than 3 entries may be dropped and any entries in that class may be placed into the adjoining class closest to that entry's age.
9. Classes 13-15 must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy evaluation by a licensed veterinarian.
10. Females with calf at side will show in class 16 regardless to age. The calf may not be more than 240 days old when shown and calves more than 120 days old must be registered with the APA. Must be natural calf and cow must be wet.
11. Bulls in classes 29, 30, 31, 34, 35, 36 and 37 must have a nose lead or ring.
12. Classes 34-37 must be accompanied by a satisfactory semen evaluation by a licensed veterinarian if offered for sale at the National Show.
13. Entry Fees are not to exceed funds required to match premiums offered, plus fair entry fees.
14. Fitting: No surgical alterations are permitted to the animals other than dehorning. No pumping or force filling with liquids, air, or any other substance. Tails are not to be balled.

Any infractions against this rule will lead to disqualification of that animal for that specific show.

SANTA GERTRUDIS

Rules & Regulations

Approved Santa Gertrudis Open and Junior Shows

Revised January 14, 2006 - Updated June 2007

1. Heifers 24 months of age or older to be eligible must have produced a calf or be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian. If animal is open due to being in an embryo transfer program this fact must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician.
2. A cow shown with calf at side: Calf must be her natural calf meeting the standard of excellence.
3. All senior bull classes (Late Junior Yearling Bull and over) must have either a nose ring or a nose clip for show purposes.
4. All animals must be individually identified by tattoo, numerical firebrand, or freeze brand.
5. To be eligible to compete in SGBI approved junior shows, animal(s) must be recorded in the name of the junior member. This recorded junior must feed, fit, care for, and show the animal entered.
6. All animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's confirmation or change its appearance. ***Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points won by same exhibitors.**
7. Each animal exhibited must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding to their correct age.
8. Entries in each class will be placed 1, 2, 3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
9. Polled classes **will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show**. Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge.
10. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals to be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence of horny tissue. Animals will be inspected by Field Service Representatives (if present), assisted by one member of Shows and Exhibits Committee or Breed Standards Committee, if needed to settle disputes. If no Field Service Representative is present, it will be done by committee members not involved in that class.
11. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
12. There must be at least five (5) exhibitors and twenty-five (25) head of cattle, or a minimum of fifty (50) head of cattle to constitute a recognized Santa Gertrudis Show.
13. In all shows in which fifty (50) head to less entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of the show officials.
14. Classes over thirty (30) entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
15. The judge **must** be an SGBI approved judge.
16. Each exhibitor must be a member in good standing with SGBI.
17. Dress for showing in an approved SGBI show shall be of clean and neat clothing. Hats or bareheaded with no caps. This is for both Open and Junior shows. **No** tennis shoes.
18. Juniors showing in open shows are allowed and encouraged. Entry must be shown by the owner or immediate family member (sister, brother, mother, father, grandparents). No animal may be fitted or shown by any open exhibitor at any time during the junior's ownership period. An exception is transportation, feed and care, to a show may be allowed. Refer to junior ownership rules.
19. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, or other appearance change for cosmetic purposes, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Silicon injection or other injections for cosmetic purposes shall be prohibited.
20. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, the owner may be asked to not display his/her cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship paper.
21. **ETHICS:** The showing of unethical fitted livestock or livestock of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered is prohibited. Unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any method altering the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body. Animals showing signs of having been operated upon or tampered with for the purpose of concealing faults in conformation or with intent to deceive relative to the animal's soundness, will be disqualified. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by him to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee as to whether such animal is unethical fitted or overage, shall be final, without recourse against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.
22. Any exhibitor, whether it be the owner or custom fitter or anyone else who has the custody of the animal being shown in any SGBI approved show, who shows an animal which has had an anabolic steroid administration to it either by injection or diuretic or any other administration, shall be barred from showing in

- an SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. The animal shall be barred from ever showing in a SGBI approved show again.
23. No pumping or filling of an animal with liquid, air or any other substance is allowed. Violations will result in disqualification and banning from all shows of that exhibitor and/or owner.
 24. Any exhibitor who knowingly shows an animal in a SGBI approved show who is in violation of the rule herein above set forth relating to showing an animal in it's natural conformation and structure as defined herein above may be suspended by the Board of Directors for six (6) months for the first offense, one year for the second offense, and for life for the third offense.
 25. Any person who furnished the birthday of the animal to SGBI either on the IPRA of some other document (whereby that birthday information is transferred to the registration certificate) and that animal is exhibited in a SGBI approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the SGBI designated veterinarian exceeds the age listed on the registration certificate by more than 30 days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certificate shall be barred from showing in a SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. However, the animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and be shown again.
 26. Each exhibitor shall submit his registered Santa Gertrudis cattle to such tests and examinations as may be requested and/or required by SGBI, its authorized representatives, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair.
 27. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgement past, present or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision there from.
 28. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association.
 29. **APPEALS:** An appeal from the decision of the veterinarian or designated association representation designated by the SGBI under sections 1 and 4 of the Inspection of Exhibits may be made to the Executive Committee of SGBI if the following requirements are satisfied:
 - (1) the appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party; and
 - (2) the appealing party files the written appeal with SGBI Board of Directors or SGBI Representative or fair officials as soon as possible after the veterinarian's or designated association representatives' decision is rendered and in any event within six (6) hours of the time of the veterinarian's or designated association representatives' decision was made. If an appeal satisfying the foregoing requirements is filed with the SGBI Board of Directors, the Board of Directors shall hold a hearing at which the appealing party and the Veterinarian or designated association representatives whose decision is being appealed shall present statements and other evidence that are relevant to the matter, following which the Board of Directors shall render a decision which shall be final and conclusive.
 30. **PROCEDURES TO FILE PROTEST:**
 1. File protest with show that infraction occurred. Follow their protest rules.
 2. File the same protest with the Shows and Exhibits Committee. Contact the chairman.
 3. Three exhibitors must sign the protest.
 4. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Shows and Exhibits Committee within twenty four hours after the occasion for such protests.
 5. Order of hearing or protest:
 1. Chairman of Shows and Exhibits Committee
 2. Action by Shows and Exhibits Committee
 3. Final action by Board of Directors
 4. Follow appeal procedures as outlined in Rules and Regulations
 6. All rules and regulations that have been properly protested to the Shows and Exhibits Committee shall be the subject to the following penalties:
 - a. Loss of premium money
 - b. Loss of awards
 - c. Suspension from showing that animal as deemed necessary. Penalty may be for one show, two, or three or as long as deemed necessary for the offense.
 - d. Suspension of the exhibitor being the same as other S.G.B.I. Rules penalties.
 31. Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show's rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules, and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.

32. **DISQUALIFICATIONS:** Any exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s), will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge over-looked an animal, will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge(s), or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude them from further competition; exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him may be moved up at the option of the Shows and Exhibits Committee, to fill the vacated position.

YOUTH BEEF BREEDING

General Rules & Regulations - All Exhibitors (See Beef Rules & Regulations)

1. The South Florida Fair believes that every youth exhibitor should receive proper training and information for raising and showing a youth animal project. 2. Exhibitors cannot be under the age of 8 or over the age of 18 as of January 1st, 2008. Exhibitors must, also be attending school or be enrolled in a certified home school program. Exhibitors who have graduated from high school or obtained their high school G.E.D. are not eligible.
3. **All cattle over 6 months old or horns over 2" in length must have horns removed.**
4. Animals must be shown in their respective age classes and be exhibited accordingly in their classes by age. Animal teeth may be checked for age at the discretion of the superintendent.
